Post Entries Accepted: Late entry fee is \$5.00 per class. You may add entries on same day – late fee still applies per class entered.

STABLING: Limited stabling is available. Day pen rentals are recommended for your enjoyment and safety horses. Overnight and day pens available. For overnight boarding: it is \$40 per night. \$70 is your board 2 nights. Day Pens are \$15 per day. Water will be provided. Hay, other feeds and bedding is not included, owner/trainer/rider will provide. Pens must be cleaned out before leaving by horse's owner/trainer/rider.

HORSES may be dropped off on the Friday before the show between 1:00pm and 5:00pm. Horses hauling on same day of show must arrive and check in before 8:30am and Hauling out after show ends. Limited day pens are available. Please get you entries in ASAP. Additional fees for Stabling may apply. All required documentation must be received with payment to confirm stalls (overnight and day pen).

FOOTING: Kahalawai Farms small arena (80' x 140') and large arena (75' x 210') are sand. Small arena will be used for warm up. Large arena will be for competition for dressage and jumper day. Large arena will be closed for warm up Friday 02-28-2025 at 5:00PM. Standard Dressage arena is 20m x 60m. Jumper Arena will be large arena dimension.

WEATHER: If show is cancelled due to weather before show date, credit will be given for the following show (Lei Day Show Series). If show starts and weather should get worse, show will be paused and continue once weather allows it. Show will go on as long it is deemed safe.

REFUND: No refund after early entry entry due date (two week prior to show). Credit will be given for following show (Lei Day Show Series) if rider and horse needs to scratch as long as request is received before the early entry due date (two weeks prior to show)

Traditional Dressage Show

1. Divisions:

1. Child (CH) - 12 years old and under on Show Date
2. Junior (JR) - 13 to 17 years old on Show Date
3. Adult Amateur (AA) - 18 years old or more on Show Date
4. Open (O)- Professional Riders/Trainers

2. SHOW AWARDS: 1st place ribbons for score above 70%; 2nd place ribbon for scores between 69.99%-65%; 3rd place ribbons between 64.99%-60%; 4th place ribbons between 59.99%-55%; 5th place ribbons between 54.99%-50%. High Point will be given to rider with the highest combined score of 2 entered test at the same level in each division.

3. SCHEDULE: Trainers & Riders will be notified of scheduled ride times by text or email.

5. Show Attire:

Show shirt, Polo Shirt, or Show jackets are optional. Light or white breeches. Tall boots or paddock boots and half chaps same color. Regulation helmet required at all time while mounted. Hair neatly pulled back or well groomed.

6. Test Offered:

A Horse may show up to 4 tests intro and training; up to 3 test for First level and above.

Traditional Dressage: All Tests Level Intro thru 4th. (2023 tests)

8. OTHER: **Maui Nui Show Rules**

Please be advised due to Maui Nui rules, no pets or smoking are allowed on the grounds. No horses allowed on the grounds or in the warm up area which are not entered in the show.

The whip is used as a training aid. Whip is optional for handler and assistant. Excessive or incorrect use of a whip on any horse is not acceptable. Handlers shall be penalized or disqualified for excessive use of a whip.

If obvious visual signs of sedation are present, it is at the discretion of the show manager or judge to excuse the horse from the show. If a horse is excused due to suspected sedation and the owner would like to challenge the decision, it is up to the owner to have blood work done by a vet on the same day.

General Rules (refer to USEF Rule Book Chapter JP Jumper Division)

1. Jumper Groups: (MN Equestrian Show Series)

2. Dressage/Western Trail Class (course will be posted near arena)

This Group is for Dressage and Western riders to test the agility of their horses. This will allow riders to qualify for All Around Dressage and Western Rider category.

Trail Class WT: Riders will be asked to trot in a specific order over a set of 3 to 4 poles laid out in arena. They will also be ask to perform transition to halt, walk or trot. And zigzag thru cones. Posting on the wrong diagonal will result in 4 faults. It is important to be on the correct diagonal even in the zigzag. All lines must be in two point position.

2 FAULTS: hitting ground poles

2 FAULTS: late on transitions

2 FAULTS: breaking gait

4 FAULTS: Missed transitions

4 FAULTS: missing a cone in zig zag

4 FAULTS: refusals, elimination after 3rd refusal

If rider goes off-course, elimination

Trail Class WTC: same requirements as Trail Class WT. In addition, riders will be asked to canter in specific section of arena.

If rider goes off-course, elimination.

WINNERS FOR TRAIL CLASSES WILL BE NEED THE FASTEST TIME TIME WITH 0 FAULTS OR LEAST AMOUNT OF FAULTS.

3. Trot Poles WT, Trot Poles WTC, and Cross-rails: (course will be posted near arena)

Trot Poles WT: Riders will be asked to trot in a specific order over a set of 3 to 4 poles laid out in arena. They will also be ask to perform transition to halt, walk or trot. And zigzag thru cones. Posting on the wrong diagonal will result in 4 faults. It is important to be on the correct diagonal even in the zigzag. All lines must be in two point position.

2 FAULTS: hitting ground poles

2 FAULTS: late on transitions

2 FAULTS: breaking gait

4 FAULTS: Missed transitions

4 FAULTS: wrong diagonal in zigzag

4 FAULTS: missing a cone in zigzag

4 FAULTS: refusals, elimination after 3rd refusal

If rider goes off-course, they will get 4 FAULTS and elimination after 2nd off-course. They must start after last correct jump

Trot Poles WTC: same requirements as Trot Poles WT. In addition, riders will be asked to canter in specific section of arena and jump 2 to 3 cross rails.

If rider goes off-course, they will get 4 faults and elimination after 2nd off-course. They must start after last correct jump.

WINNERS FOR TROT POLES CLASSES WILL NEED THE FASTEST TIME WITH 0 FAULTS OR LEAST AMOUNT OF FAULTS.

Cross Bar: all jumps may be approached in the trot or canter. Riders may canter thru a line.

4 FAULTS: Drop Rails

4 FAULTS: Refusal, elimination after 3rd refusal

If rider goes off-course, elimination.

4. All Jumper Classes (.75m and up):

Time does not apply for any purpose except as provided for in JP145.7 through JP145.9 of the Table of Faults.

1. Knock Down and Out (Table II, Sec. 5) The winner to be the competitor clearing the most obstacles without a fault.

2. **Tie Breaker** - Jump off as described in Table II, Sec 2 (a)

JP149 TABLE IV—Optimum Time Classes - between WT and 0.70m classes.

Classes are scored on Faults under Table II, however, all ties are broken on the basis of Optimum Time.

1. Optimum Time in First Round (Table IV Sec. 1)—The first round is decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. In the case of equality of faults, ties will be broken on the following basis: an "Optimum Time" (defined as 4 seconds less than the Time Allowed for the course) will be

posted on the course plan; the horse with the time on course closest to this Optimum Time (over or under) will prevail in the tie, next closest next, etc.

2. Course Time Allowed is calculated based on Table on page JP 39 of USEF Rule Book

JP132 Speed, Time Allowed, Time Limit, and Optimum Time (JP-22 of USEF Rule Book)

3. Calculation. The Time Allowed to complete the course should be calculated from an actual measurement of the course’s length for all rounds and jump-offs. However, if the number of turns on the course or the size of the ring suggests that the calculated Time Allowed may prove unfair in practice, speed may be adjusted prior to the start of the competition.

4. Speed. The Time Allowed is based on a minimum speed of 350 meters per minute (382 yards per minute). If a speed other than 350 m/m (382 yards per minute) is to be used, it must be printed in the prize list. Where the arena size is 5,000 square meters or more (approximately 55m x 90m [180ft x 300ft]) the maximum speed to be used for any division shall be 375 meters/min. In arenas of less than 5,000 square meters the maximum speed to be used shall be 350 meters/min. Kahalawai Farms Speed will be 355 yds/min for Group 3 and up; Group 1 & 2 speed will be 328yds per min.

5. Reference Times. The Time Allowed must be announced and posted prior to the start of the class. After the first competitor has completed his round, the Time Allowed and the competitor’s time should be announced. In cases where an electronic read out board is not

visible to riders in the in-gate area, the reference times for the first three riders should be announced.

6. Adjustment of the Time Allowed. The Time Allowed may be adjusted at the sole discretion of the Judge(s), if they feel it is inaccurate, but only after consultation with the course designer. However, the time allowed may only be adjusted once during the early rounds of a given competition, never later than after the third competitor to complete the course without a disobedience or if any of the first three take more than 45 seconds to cross the start line. The time allowed can never be lowered so that time faults will be awarded to any previous competitor that has started the course within the 45 seconds and completed the course without a disobedience.

7. Time Limit. The 'Time Limit' is defined as double the Time Allowed.

8. Optimum Time. For classes scored under Table IV the optimum time is defined as 4 seconds less than the Time Allowed. (USEF JP-22)

9. Each height class will have a course A and B posted near arena.

10. A horse may be entered in up to 3 jump classes for classes 2'0"/0.65m and up with the same rider. A horse may be entered in two different heights if ridden by 2 riders but cannot exceed the 3 jump classes entered. Group 1 Classes: a horse may enter up to 4 times.

12. Show Attire:

Grand Champion Award:

Riders competing on both days (*min. 2 tests on dressage day and 2 classes on Jumper day*) qualify for our Grand Champion Award for the weekend. Award is given on Sunday at the conclusion of our Jumper show.
